- Work in groups of five. Look at the pairs of opposite places. Discuss about how they are different.
- Each member should choose one pair of the locations and search on the Internet for places like those in the city of Madrid, its suburbs or the whole of the Comunidad de Madrid.
- Find pictures to illustrate them and write an article providing a description of them. This can be done in the class or as homework.
- When this is done each member of the group will get together with people from other groups working on the same area as they are (1 - 5). Design it as if it was a poster from a travel agency. They could print them and display them in the class. All the information will be gathered and posted to a Padlet <https://es.padlet.com/> created by the teacher.
- Then the results will be presented to the rest of the class.
